Item #3 – Elect Chairperson for Committee

Motion by Krueger, second by Chief Mireski to elect Chief MacNeill as Chairperson for the Municipal Court Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

Item #4 – Discuss Multi-Jurisdictional Municipal Court.

The Mayville Joint Municipal Court Committee consists of Brad Seymour, Chris Mireski, Chris MacNeill, Lois Krueger and Alt. Darlene Smith.

Chief MacNeill presented an Ordinance to Create a Joint Municipal Court for the City of Mayville, Village of Lomira and Village of Brownsville for review.

A. **Establish Priority List for Creation of Municipal Court.**

We need to start looking at a possible budget formulation. Determine what each municipality's citations have been annually for the past three years. This will determine the number of times we have court throughout the month. Also the judge's salary and everything else will be based on that projected revenue. Municipal Court will be held every month which will be the second Tuesday of the month. Juvenile Intake will take place at 1:15 p.m. and Regular Intake will take place at 1:30 p.m. There will be no night court. The judge must be a qualified elector who will be appointed and then elected for a four year term, commencing on May 1st after election.

In the Joint Operations Agreement the City of Mayville shall pay the initial costs for creating the court. After which, the Court costs as established by Wisconsin State Statues shall pay all costs related to the operation of the court. The parties to this agreement shall adopt uniform bond schedules for violations of ordinances within the municipal boundaries. Any of the parties may elect to terminate this agreement upon 90 days written notice to the Clerks of the other municipalities. Judge Storck needs to sign off and certify us as a municipal court. Proposed start date is January 12, 2016.
