A. Year End Report.

Total incident calls were 62 for the 2014 year. The most calls were 14 for fire alarms. The highest amount of calls took place in November with the busiest day of the week being on Mondays and busiest time from noon-6 p.m. 684 hours at fires/incidents, 571 hours at meetings, 1031 hours at training, 1,044 hours at schooling and 636 hours of fire prevention.

B. Personnel Update.

There are 30 firefighters at this time. There is an average of seven firefighters who respond to a call.

C. Training Update.

It was made mandatory that members have to attend 75% of the practices and 50% of the meetings. Everyone for the first time met the requirements. Our attendance and moral are outstanding at this time.

D. Apparatus Update.

Jon Borst reported on the fire department equipment. Truck 2964 had an anti-freeze leak from a bad hose and rusty connection. It was down about 4 hours. HD came in and fixed it and is now up and running. Truck 2965 had a fast idle issue, not working at all, took to Inland Power, found loose wiring, checked all the relays, lots of diagnostic work and is now working The truck was gone for 3 days. The ladder truck had an air compressor had a condensing value failing, EMA replaced and is now operational. At the weekly truck check he noticed 1 of the cellnoids is going out. EMA will be giving a quote on this repair cost.
