Citizen Comments.

Jayne Gohr of 280 Mountin Drive came to the podium to speak. She did ask all to speak up so that everyone can hear. She noted that last month Ald. Sertich read a statement into the record. Jayne continued that Ed Hilbert never implied such statement. She continued that the statement was an unfair interpretation that Mr. Hilbert did not have a chance to respond. She continued that the objection is recorded at the county. Jayne gave history that her Father, Mr. Hilbert, sold Tom Vollmer an improved lot for \$1 many years ago. She explained that the it was an improved lot because it had sewer lines. Jayne gave history to the lot lines and sewer lines of Tom Vollmer's property of 230 High Street. She continued that on May 17 an existing sewer line was exposed and it lined up with the center of the garage portion of the home. Jayne stated that the garage is on the northern side of the home. Then the sewer line turns right. She has yet to hear from the County that the survey was an error. She continued that there is no record of Tom's acknowledgement of notification of lot line placement. She believes that Tom improperly placed the home on the lot.

Bill Linzenmeyer came to the podium. He spoke of the denial of liquor license item and the letter that was sent out to the Alderpersons. He noted that the letter was not an accurate letter. There have been 91 complaints since 2005. He commented to follow through on the denial.

Tom Vollmer of 230 South High Street came to the podium. He stated that he built his house in 1968 and used the stakes from the cemetery. He commented that in 2002 Dodge County came in and resurveyed the area, and it has not been right since. Tom continued that he could not sell his house as it is now. Jane Vollmer of 230 South High Street came to the podium. She questioned how their yard could be moved into the cemetery and if the cemetery was notified.
