Water Distribution System Update

- Failed communications radios were replaced with an updated version for alarms.
- Well #2 has parts on the way to be put back into service.
- Dayton Street failed water valves have been replaced.
- -CCR (Consumer Confidence Report) has been submitted and published.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Operations Update

- The second round of adjustments has been made for chemical feed pumps to be in DNR compliance by July 1.

-On June 8th the Fourth Street lift station pipe ruptured due to a rock slowly wearing a hole. During the operation while hauling wet well waste to a gravity main the jetter broke a PTO shaft and subsequently a radiator. Repairs are underway and Kewaskum Utilities is the current emergency back-up. This spill required an SSO (Sewer System Overflow) report that has been submitted.

- CMAR (Compliance Maintenance Annual Report) and DMR (Daily Monitoring Report) for May 2020 have both been submitted to the DNR.

Buildings Report

Alliant energy was checking gas lines around the pavilion last week and noticed the gas line that goes thru the sidewalk and into the building has corroded to the point he could push a key thru the gas line. I'm waiting for a bid from Bernhard Plumbing to get that fixed. The gas is turned off to the building as of right now.

Grounds Report
