Discuss/Recommend Changes to Ordinances 397-13 and 312-7 Regarding Snowmobiles in City Parks

This would create a trail through the park to get to the snowmobile trail. The speed and noise ordinances would still apply. Ald. Smith noted that this only benefits people that border the parks.
