Water Distribution System Update

- Main break on Horicon Street near BP on 9/9. Concrete repairs have been completed.
- The site plan for lead and copper sampling was approved. All 21 samples have been collected and analyzed. All test homes notifications are complete as well as DNR compliance notifications. We are working on obtaining a grant to remove lead services from homes in 2021.
- The fluoride ordinance repeal was introduced on 9/14 and the ordinance allowing the addition of fluoride was repealed on 10/12/2020.
- Valve exercising has started and is expected to take a couple months.

- We have submitted a work comp injury due to a fall. All corrective actions have been taken to correct the situation.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Operations Update

- Whole effluent toxicity testing requirements per the DNR have been completed. Testing is complete and went well.
- Televising approximately 15,000 feet of sanitary sewer has been scheduled. The focus of these inspections will be on previously untelevised and problematic areas.
- One clarifier has been taken offline due to drive issues. A drive is expected to be replaced toward the end of October.
- All sunken sidewalks from the previous lateral ordinance on German Street have been repaired.

OTHER ITEMS OF DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION <u>Discuss with Possible Action Stormwater Management Study from Kunkel Engineering</u> <u>Group</u>

Don Neitzel presented the stormwater management study. He explained the history of the problem. There were studies done in 1985, 2003 and 2020. In 1985 there were storm sewers replaced by St. Johns. In 2003 there were stormwater retention improvements North of Horicon. Don noted that there had been discussion of a the problem starting by Hwy V and the landfill. Most of the problems are in the industrial park because of hard surfaces and roofs. He described the flow of the water. There could be work done by Willow Court, Springbrook Corut and Kekoskee street, but it will be expensive and may not fully solve the problem. He believes putting in some retention ponds near the industrial park. The locations of the ponds were discussed by Gleason, the west side of Seneca and the Parkview site. There was discussion on running it to the river. When the industrial park was created there was not stormwater management plans in place at that time. Don will come up with cost estimates.
