a. Buildings Report

The kitchen in the upstairs at the Pavilion was in need of a small remodel. There was a lot of water damage to the existing floor. The floor had to be ripped out. New underlayment and flooring was installed. The flooring is now waterproof flooring. The walls were all repaired from years of damage. New lights are going to be installed along with a new refrigerator. There is going to be some changes to the kayak launch this spring so the existing launch can be used no matter the height of the river.
